We are excited to announce that our town has been awarded a federal grant to construct a brand-new community center for everyone to enjoy. The town board worked diligently to identify essential features that would meet our needs and align with the priorities of the grant application.

As a result, the community center will include updated public meeting rooms, new town offices, a tele-med room, free 24/7 internet access space, and public restrooms. However, the grant does not cover upgraded furnishings, infrastructure, artwork, and other elements that would enhance the beauty and functionality of the space. While we plan to repurpose some existing furnishings, we are seeking sponsorships, including naming rights for specific areas of the facility.

This is a wonderful opportunity for historic businesses, families, and lake neighborhoods in the Town of Plum Lake to contribute and be memorialized through signage within the center.
